Acts 3:1-8 & 16b ... One day Peter and John were going up to the temple at the time of prayer—at three in the afternoon. 2 Now a man who was lame from birth was being carried to the temple gate called Beautiful, where he was put every day to beg from those going into the temple courts. 3 When he saw Peter and John about to enter, he asked them for money. 4 Peter looked straight at him, as did John. Then Peter said, "Look at us!" 5 So the man gave them his attention, expecting to get something from them.6 Then Peter said, "Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." 7 Taking him by the right hand, he helped him up, and instantly the man's feet and ankles became strong. 8 He jumped to his feet and began to walk. Then he went with them





into the temple courts, walking and jumping, and praising God... faith in His [Jesus'] Name—has made this man strong whom you see and know, and the faith that is through Jesus has given the man this perfect health in the presence of you all.

This once crippled, but now healed man got more than he bargained for! Read Acts 3 and you'll notice that he wasn't asking to be healed. He wasn't looking to be saved. He certainly wasn't expecting to be enlisted in a movement to bring about the new creation. He just wanted some spare change, maybe get a free lunch out of the deal. But, by faith in Jesus, he is swept up in a miracle and a dangerous, high-stakes, exhilarating mission that will stretch them all past their breaking point, demanding of them beyond what they could have managed on their own, ultimately unleashing God's healing for the whole creation—blessing and joy and praise beyond knowing. But it started with just a request for a little help.

And maybe that's all you need from Jesus today. Just a little help. A little extra money. An answered prayer that you'll get better or feel better. Some wisdom for a difficult decision. Whatever it is that you're asking of Jesus, or of His people, it's probably too small. And mixed in, you're probably asking for the wrong things, or the right things in the wrong proportion, or at the wrong time, or for the wrong reasons. But that's okay. It's just a starting point. Jesus will take you wherever you are. So, whatever it is, go ahead, ask it. You can trust Jesus to take care of it, in His time, in His way, and for your good.

Because He cares for you. He loves you. He created you and died and rose again for you, lives and reigns and will return for you. And in the meantime, He has all the resources, all the connections, all the power to help, heal, save, and make new—materially, spiritually, relationally—and He promises to do just that in God's time, to free you from sin and evil, to align you fully with God's will, to make you like Him in His death, so that you will, one day, share in His resurrection, in His life and perfect health.

So, ask Him—ask Him for whatever you think might help today. And realize that what you are getting in Him, in this Person, this Friend, this Mentor, King, and a Brother with a story like no other, Jesus will be more than you bargained for.

Grace Church Financial Update



"I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing... If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples. – John 15

We are One Together in ministry. Jesus is the Vine and we are the branches and connected to him we will produce much! In fact, connected to Him all things are possible!

The approved budget: Our Grace budget for the fiscal year 2023-2024 is set at **\$490,000** which calls for weekly gifts of **\$9423.** Last week's gifts totaled **\$13,349.35.** (This included a special gift of \$10,000)

Year to date: As of last week, the total amount of gifts we <u>should have</u> reached is **\$395,769**. However, at week 42, the amount in gifts <u>we have received</u> for the Lord's ministry is **\$319,080**.

Shortfall: Currently, there is a gap of **\$76,689** between the amount received and the amount budgeted.

We are grateful for the gifts of love that God's people have brought! This past week in addition to our weekly gifts several members have approached our leadership at Grace and have committed to make gifts to the Lord that will cover the shortfall and address some of our additional expenses! We praise God for moving the hearts of his people to express their love for Christ is such a generous manner!

Weekly Gifts: It's important to note that while our budget shortfall will be covered we still have an approved budget which requires **weekly gifts of \$9423**. We pray that every member at Grace is moved by their love for the Lord to give as generously and faithfully as He has enable each to do. The Apostle Paul encouraged the church with these words "Each one should give as he has determined in his heart, not reluctantly or under pressure, for God loves a cheerful giver. God is able to make all grace overflow to you, so that in all things, at all times, having all that you need, you will overflow in every good work... You will be made rich in every way so that you may be generous in every way, which produces thanksgiving to God through us. (1 Corinthians 9:7-8,11)

Additional expenses:

- At the moment it would appear that our insurance will not cover the total cost of the school restoration from this winter's pipe burst and water damage.
- We are also in dire need of roof repair at the school.
- The demolition cost and fees for the properties next to school have greatly exceeded the bid that PMG gave to us.

Grace Ministry has been blessed with many financial miracles for many years. God is good! We pray that God's children will give generously and joyfully according to His will. We are One Together in ministry.

Pacific Northwest District Convention – June 4th & 5th

Location: Evergreen Lutheran High School at 7306 Waller Road East, Tacoma, WA 98443.

Presentation / Theme — Rejoice! The Christian's Battle Cry. Prof. Joel Russow of Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary will present on three areas of strengthening relationships and extending Christlike love to lonely and hurting hearts. "In this world you will have trouble." We live in a world of death, mourning, crying, and pain. The bruising troubles of this life and the heavy barrage of the devil's attacks leave hearts, relationships, and homes lonely and hurting. But Jesus also said, "Take heart! I have overcome the world." (John 16:33)

Lay Delegate Attendance and Credentials — "Each congregation of the district shall be represented by a lay delegate, who shall be certified to the secretary of the district by his congregation" At this biennial convention each congregation seats one male lay delegate to represent your church and to vote. For that reason we ask that you would provide your delegate the proper materials and the credentials (Online Delegate Form) from the congregation they represent.

District Dues — Since "all expenses of the district convention... shall be paid by the membership of the district" your dues help cover convention expenses and provide modest travel equalization subsidy for those serving in the outer regions of our large district, as well as provide counseling for our called workers in the PNW.

Report to the Twelve Districts - Each congregation will receive one printed copy of the report by late May. A full electronic version will be available online in the first week of May. Please review the online material before the convention, so you are informed on discussions that may take place at the convention. Additionally, Floor Committees are being assembled to divide up the RTTD for summary and celebration at the convention.

Elections – Positions on the presidium and within the district be elected at this convention. This year, we have the privilege of electing our next District President following President Steinbrenner's move to Wisconsin.

FROM THE WELS

The number of vacancies for pastor, teacher, and staff minister positions continues to present a real challenge for congregations throughout our synod. At the direction of last summer's synod convention, a special task force has been formed to study the issue of enrollment at our synodical schools and bring



recommendations regarding how we can encourage more young people to prepare for the public ministry.

Thankfully, we are approaching the month of May when some relief will be provided for the vacancy situation. The Conference of Presidents will be meeting as the synod's Assignment Committee to assign teacher and staff minister candidates from Martin Luther College (MLC), New Ulm, Minn., and to assign pastoral candidates at Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary (WLS), Mequon, Wis., to their first calls.

This year at MLC, 145 candidates will be available for assignment. Some of those will be teachers who will be assigned to their first calls; others who were assigned for one year last year will either be permanently assigned to the call in which they are now serving or be reassigned to new locations. Thirty-seven of the candidates are restricted in where they can serve due to marriage or other circumstances. Many of these will be assigned in May; others will receive assignments in the weeks and months after call day. **CALL DAY IS MAY 18th**.

At WLS, 27 men will be assigned as pastors. Most of those will serve in parishes; several will be assigned to one-year calls in one of our ministerial education schools as tutors. The Assignment Committee, with the input of the seminary, will also assign 40 men as vicars in congregations throughout our synod. Many of those will be assigned as "Vicars in Mission" to home mission congregations. **CALL DAY IS MAY 23rd.**

Assignment days at MLC and WLS are joyful days—joyful for the young men and women who learn where God will have them serve in the ministry and joyful for the members of the synod who see God keeping his promise to send workers into his harvest field. Keep giving thanks to God for these gifts to his church and keep praying that God will provide even more workers in the years to come.

Board for Home Missions: The BHM will met on April **18-19** to review and evaluate new mission requests. It is with great joy that we can report that the request to start a new mission in Bend, Oregon was approved by the BHM. This means that a pastor will be call from the field or requested from the Seminary to lead this new mission effort.

PRISON MINISTRY

"The prisoners are able to live their faith.... It's amazing to see how God works [and] gets his Word out through these guys," says Matt Brown about his ministry at the Harris County jail.

Since 2017, Brown, pastor at Abiding Word, Houston, Texas, has been ministering to prisoners at the Harris County jail, the third largest jail in the country with more than 10,000 prisoners. With the support of his congregation and help from volunteers, Brown has reached more than 3,000 prisoners with God's Word. Not only have Brown and the volunteers shared God's Word with the inmates but they also have preached the gospel to healthcare and detention workers.

"God's Word does work," says retired pastor Don Tollefson about his experience volunteering at the Harris County jail. "Many [prisoners] are open and willing to listen—they're at this point in life that they need something that is more than themselves."

Dave Hochmuth, director of WELS Prison Ministry, says, "Jesus died for these people too.... There are some huge barriers to getting people back to the body of Christ, and we need people who have the heart for that, who are willing to reach out to somebody who is not like them."

Numerous partnerships have developed to support this ministry. WELS Prison Ministry provides training for the volunteers. Brown uses existing materials from Institutional Ministries, WELS Prison Ministry, Time of Grace, and WELS Multi-Language Productions to preach the good news of Jesus to the inmates. Having some of these resources available in both English and Spanish has increased the reach even more, especially as other chaplains have begun to use these materials.

Through the partnerships and relationships formed, thousands of people have heard God's saving Word. "This is what God has called us to do—to serve in love," says Brown.
